Community Support Workers at CLKD assist individuals with developmental disabilities in all aspects of their support plans, including living active lives in our community. Our staff have helped individuals settle into new homes, plant and harvest in our community gardens, participate in awareness events at local public schools, and join public speaking workshops that took them on the air to share their stories! Our staff also help individuals to reach their own personal goals like starting music lessons, participating in art classes, or learning how to ride a horse.

Responsibilities:

- Provide personal care and cognitive, social and/or emotional support using a person-centered approach.
- Provide assistance with a variety of household activities.
- Prepare nutritious and varied meals, as determined by care plans, using proper food preparation, storage and hygiene practices.
- Promote a safe environment for both staff and supported individuals.

Qualifications and Position Requirements:

- Applicants with a Developmental Service Worker Diploma are preferred, and experience in the Developmental Services field or comparable post-secondary education in a relevant field is an asset.
- Must be available to work a variety of shifts including days, overnight and weekends on an on-call basis.
- Other requirements include: a current criminal record check, valid G Driver's License, use of a reliable adequately insured vehicle, and a valid First Aid/CPR certificate.

Compensation and Benefits:

- Competitive Wages; entry level positions start at \$23.25 per hour for day shift and \$17.42 per hour for overnight shift.
- Paid multi-day orientation (in-field training).
- Ongoing skills training opportunities; CLKD is a learning organization that evaluates its work, employs best practices and is innovative in its approaches.
- Strong organizational culture; CLKD values and recognizes the contributions of staff and volunteers, fosters strong team approaches, and is honest and inviting in its communication practices.
- Supportive Leadership.
